




Request for Contributions to ASCE Lehigh Valley Section “Top 100 Civil Engineering Landmarks” Photo Book

To celebrate the Centennial of the ASCE Lehigh Valley Section in 2022, we will be producing a commemorative photo book of “The Lehigh Valley’s Top 100 Civil Engineering Landmarks” and publishing it no later than December 2021.

Please support this project by nominating your favorite civil engineering landmark for inclusion in the “Top 100” book.

To be eligible for inclusion in the book, a landmark must be:

- A significant civil engineering achievement in structural, geotechnical, transportation, water resources, environmental, or construction engineering.
- Located within the ASCE Lehigh Valley Section’s geographic area of responsibility (pictured at right).
- Currently existing (though it need not be performing its original function).
- Sited such that it can be photographed (unless high-quality photos are already available).



Our principal criteria for selecting the “Top 100” will be as follows:

- (1) The landmark must be “significant,” meaning that either:
 - a. it is of historical importance; or
 - b. it is particularly important to quality of life and economic development in the Lehigh Valley region; or
 - c. it employed a new or innovative technology at the time it was constructed; or
 - d. its construction overcame particularly daunting challenges.
- (2) Civil engineering works for which particularly compelling photographs are available (or can be obtained) will receive special consideration.

If interested in preparing a nomination:

- (1) **As soon as possible**, send an email with ***the name of the landmark you are planning to nominate***. We will ensure that no one else is nominating the same landmark and then give you the go-ahead to submit a full nomination.
- (2) **No later than August 1, 2021**, submit the full nomination, consisting of the following:
 - Name, location, and purpose of the landmark
 - A brief description of the landmark
 - A brief historical summary of its design, construction, and use (if known)
 - Justification for selection of the nomination as a “Top 100” landmark.
 - One or more digital images of the landmark (if available)
 - References for more information about the landmark (if available)

The complete nomination should be no more than two pages long. One person may nominate multiple landmarks. Both submissions should be emailed to Pete Terry, Chair of the LVASCE 100th Anniversary Planning Committee at peter.terry@bencivil.com
